IMPD Staffing Study Commission Report



The IMPD Staffing Study Commission has released a report listing ways to get the funding necessary to support the extra officers the department needs for better police coverage and response times. The report recommends raising the Public Safety Income Tax to 0.50% and to phase out the COIT Homestead Credit (NOTE: this is NOT the same as the Homestead Deduction), among other measures. Getting rid of the COIT Homestead Credit would cost about \$20-\$30 per year for residents in our area.



Movies on the Lawn in Garfield Park


