Another Great Chili Cook-Off Last Month



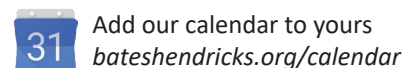
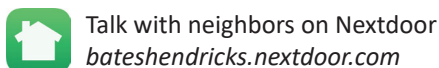
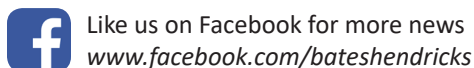

The neighborhood association is considering reducing the speed limit in some or all of the neighborhood. The current neighborhood-wide speed limit is 30 mph, whether marked as such or not.
