Lydia Brasher's Passing is a True Loss to Bates-Hendricks



On Thursday, September 21, the neighborhood lost Lydia Brasher, a wonderful neighbor, friend, and community leader. Lydia lived in Bates-Hendricks for 66 years — most of her life — and cared greatly for the neighborhood and her neighbors. She was always kind and willing to help out, but she was no push-over and was never afraid to voice her viewpoint or get answers to her questions. She could regularly be seen in the mornings walking around the neighborhood, picking up trash and helping to keep an eye on things in the area. She would help set up many of our cookouts and holiday dinners, and was responsible for printing and arranging delivery of this newsletter for many years. She will be greatly missed by those who knew her.

She attended School #18, graduated from Manual High School, and earned a BS and MS from Indiana University. Lydia was an elementary school librarian for thirty-

eight years, retiring in 2004. Lydia was the Secretary of the Bates-Hendricks board for over a decade, stepping down only when her health prohibited her continued service. Southeast Neighborhood Development (SEND) recognized her years of work in the community with the Helen Fehr Award in 2016.

Lydia's memorial service will be held September 30 at 1:00pm at Central Christian Church, 701 N. Delaware Street.
