Mrs. Jacobs believes her job goes beyond teaching math into the realm of teaching kindness and compassion. Together, Mrs. Jacobs and her 7th grade scholars have spearheaded several kindness initiatives, leaving a lasting impression on our school and our scholars. As a team, they have painted ceiling tiles with positive messages, created a teacher appreciation wall, encouraged younger scholars during testing, created items for our sensory room, and raised money for hurricane victims, among other initiatives. Recently, we asked her 7th grade scholars a few questions about kindness. Here are some of their responses:

"To me, kindness is something that you do where you don't want a thing in return. Kindness is when you're nice even when the crowd is being wrong or mean."

"Kindness to me means a lot of things. It means not bullying, listening to your friends and family, and trying not to disrespect anyone."

"Our random acts of kindness have impacted our school by showing the younger children, and even some of the teachers, how to be a good person. It taught a lot of children how to be strong and confident in tests and other work."

"Around the school many of the classrooms have spread kindness. The teachers know that they are appreciated and they also want to show kindness."

"[Random acts of kindness have] impacted me by making my life better at school and at home."

"[Random acts of kindness] have affected me a lot by letting me know that even a small thing that you make and give to someone will make them happy."




Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association
