SENSE Charter School By Kate Voss

SENSE Charter School, through a partnership with Southeast Community Services, arranged for a full-size replica Tyrannosaurus Rex skull to be on display at their school. This was made possible through the Chicago Field Museum's diplomat program. "Norm," named after a benefactor of the Chicago Field Museum, was on display in the school for ten days.

Teachers incorporated specific lessons on paleontology into their regular curriculum. It was the focus of SENSE's Family Science Night and students in every class participated, including creating artwork featuring the skull. It was a memorable experience for the entire



school and when "Norm" was returned, the younger children asked when he would be back.

SENSE would like to thank Southeast Community Services and the Chicago Field Museum for bringing this unique experience to our students, many of whom have never had the opportunity to travel outside of our city. SENSE Charter is a Kindergarten through 8th grade community school, located in the Bates Hendricks neighborhood.


Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association
