Bates-Hendricks Land Use Committee Created

Neighbors may have noticed that orange public hearing signs are popping up all around Bates-Hendricks. This is not surprising, given the rising interest in the neighborhood over the last couple of years. The neighborhood is seeing lots of exciting changes, such as new neighbors and new businesses, which also means an increase in new construction.

In the past, Bates-Hendricks may have seen three to four of these signs a year; now it's more like three to four a month. To protect the integrity and character of the neighborhood during this time of rapid change, in May of 2018 the Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association formed the Land Use Committee to review these petitions.

Most of the homes and buildings in the neighborhood were first developed in the early 1900s, well before zoning restrictions. Therefore, the existing architecture of the neighborhood and the current zoning restrictions don't always mesh. Any time someone wants to change the footprint of a property, like adding a garage or an addition, property owners must petition the city for a variance which then goes to public hearing. As a neighborhood, Bates-Hendricks is given a voice at the public hearings, which can influence whether the petition is approved. This has given Bates-Hendricks the opportunity to work with developers to come up with mutually beneficial solutions.

Every fourth Tuesday of the month, the Land Use Committee meets with petitioners to review their requests at Immanuel United Church of Christ at 6:30pm. Additionally, the Land Use Committee is working to develop a Land Use Plan for the neighborhood, a set of guidelines for development in the neighborhood.

Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association


