# City of Indianapolis Leaf Collection Runs Until Dec. 4

The City of Indianapolis will once again be picking up leaves weekly on our regular trash day (Tuesdays) until December 4. Each household is permitted 40 bags of leaves for weekly disposal. Put leaves in large plastic trash bags and set them out at your usual trash pickup location at least 3 feet away from trash carts. Pickup runs from 7:00am until the end of the day and will not necessarily be at the same time of day as your trash cart pickup. 


# **Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association**
