### Letter from the President


Bates-Hendricks has been working in partnership with our community school, James A. Garfield School 31, to determine the possibility of making this school the focus of Indianapolis Public School's efforts on the south side. I'm happy to report that both the school and school board have given us the go-ahead to host a community forum to start educating the community on options, as well as soliciting feedback on the direction of the school.

This forum will be held on February 27 from 6:00pm to 7:30pm at School 31. Childcare will be available for families as well. The purpose of this community forum is to ensure the needs and desires of the community are considered in the decision-making process. We believe that this school and our community has an amazing opportunity to lead the way in creating a school that best fits our neighborhood's mission of inclusive growth.

Attendees will learn about the current state of education on the Southeast side and the options for School 31. Small group sessions will be moderated by community leaders, school staff members, IPS School Board members, and IPS administration. Surveys will be available in person, online, and at locations throughout the community starting this month.

I hope that current and future families will join community members at this meeting so we can begin to advocate for our needs.

#### **SENSE Charter School Receives Sustainability Certification**



SENSE Charter School was one of 53 schools in Marion County to be awarded the inaugural Indianapolis Thriving School Challenge (ITSC) certification for demonstrating their existing desire for sustainability education and programming in schools. Mayor Hogsett and the Office of Sustainability joined this celebration at the Indiana State Museum on January 17 to give out the awards. Two SENSE staff members and five students were on hand to receive the award.

The Indianapolis Thriving Schools Challenge is a green schools

certification program for Marion County. Schools may reach certification either by starting new projects or demonstrating their existing initiatives. Selected schools are eligible for up to \$5,000 in funding for implementing new projects or expanding existing projects. SENSE Charter was awarded the highest honor possible – the Gold certification – for their established green programming implemented at the school. Now, the plan is to expand the school's community garden, recycling, and composting projects with this new funding.
