As a neighborhood association, we are tasked with improving the quality of life for the residents in our community. Through discussions with various community partners and neighbors, we identified a need for family support in our neighborhood, both generally and at neighborhood events. Our monthly parent meetups at Lincoln Lane have been a great source of general parent support and connection, as well as a sounding board for me to ensure that our events are family-friendly. Through feedback, we are working on a few changes to our events and including new focuses for our neighborhood.

At our chili cook-off last month, we offered a kids' section full of toys and kidfriendly food options thanks to the Bulow Family. We are discussing childcare at

our monthly meetings to allow families to attend without worrying about securing care. A major focus for the parent group is regarding improvements to Baumann Park, including new, natural playground equipment and safety measures. We're also discussing bringing low-cost or free music and art classes to the Lincoln Center for families. This week, we partnered with James A. Garfield School 31 to host their first community forum on the future of the school. A full report will be released from this meeting soon, but I was glad to see many familiar faces participating in the future of this school.
