On Saturday, May 4, Bates-Hendricks neighbors are once again showing Indianapolis what "neighborhood" is all about. They are gathering to work together from 9:00am to Noon on one of the most popular pocket parks in the city: the 1400 to 1600 blocks of South New Jersey Street.

The street is known for its 800-foot garden, historic lights, and historic gazebo that date back to the 1850's. However, the garden and the gazebo don't maintain themselves and they aren't as inviting without that maintenance. Neighbors and partners therefore plan to work together to make it happen.

The garden is intensively planted with boxwood, grasses, hostas, and hydrangeas. Every few years it has to be mulched. One of our neighborhood partners, Indiana Mulch and Stone, is donating most of the mulch to make that happen. The gazebo has to be reroofed and repainted. Another neighborhood partner, Johnson and Johnson contractors from Greenwood, is donating the roof for the structure. Many neighbors spent much of our Great Indy Cleanup on April 6 scraping the historic structure in preparation for the painting (pictured). Money for painting the gazebo came from prize money won by the street in a project that was supported by Keep Indianapolis Beautiful and offered by Indianapolis Neighborhood Resource Center. The winning category was "Inspiring Places." And, I would ask, "How could any neighborhood or community be more inspired, particularly if it is blessed by so many neighbors and community partners?" Thank you for all for your help making South New Jersey Street an "Inspiring Place"!

These are vital connections in the brain that are responsible for sight, touch, sound, etc., which enable kids to complete complex, multi-stage tasks. 


Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association
