We have found a partner in Kinetic Recreation who has worked to ensure that the playground will be perfect for our space. If we are able to raise the money and receive the matching grant, we anticipate the new playground will be installed in April, just in time for use in the spring.







Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association
