# Street Fest Planning is Ramping Up!



Our undocumented immigrant families have a larger challenge, as they do not qualify for the checks being provided as part of the CARES Act. Families are cut off from many of their safety nets.

These valued partners help ensure the well-being of families by providing us with food to distribute. 


# **Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association**
