#### New Program Aims to Create a Neighborhood of Community Builders

As we in Bates-Hendricks continue our ongoing efforts to create that "traditional neighborhood feel" amongst our neighbors, community partners, visitors, and potential future neighbors, I'm proud to be able to briefly discuss this new, quickly-growing, initiative with all of you: the Bates-Hendricks Block Hosts (BHBH) program.

The Block Hosts program, led by our Block Host Coordinator Ashley Eason, aims to achieve three primary goals: build community, streamline communication, and keep our community safe. The Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association board members are excited for the fresh ideas and perspectives that will hopefully result from this autonomous, neighbor-led effort.

Block Hosts are required to serve two years in the role; however, other than hosting a minimum of two events on their block per year and meeting other minor expectations, the Block Host role was intentionally built to allow for creative freedom so each resident Block Host can encourage others to build closer relationships with nearby neighbors and/or find their ideal volunteer niche within Bates-Hendricks. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 2**  This program is not meant to replace or be confused with Keep Indianapolis Beautiful's existing "Adopt a Block" program, a beautification-focused effort in which many of our Bates-Hendricks neighbors currently choose to participate to improve their block. We envision our Block Hosts and KIB Block Captains working alongside one another in some aspects, but are ultimately two separate volunteer positions.

Whether you just moved into the neighborhood or have lived here for 40 years, everyone is welcome to participate! Now that the initial application wave has concluded, Block Host applications will be accepted on a rolling, first-come first-serve basis, so check our BHNA website today to learn more and help us out! ### **SENSE Teachers Receive Funding from DonorsChoose**

With physical schools and summer camps closed due to the pandemic, DonorsChoose sponsored a pilot project called Keep Kids Learning. Through this program, teachers were able to shop for urgent and essential items — from pre-approved items available on either Amazon.com or Walmart.com — to get their students what they need directly. Founded in 2000 by a high school teacher in the DonorsChoose Bronx. empowers public school teachers from across the country to request much-needed materials and experiences for their students. It allows individuals to donate directly to public school classroom projects and was among the first civic crowdfunding platform of its kind.

Several teachers at SENSE Charter School applied to the Keep Kids Learning program and were awarded \$1,000 each to make purchases to support students and their families over the summer break. This included food and hygiene items to be distributed to families of SENSE to help support their well-being and help keep them fed. Additional projects included activity kits that were comprised of books, healthy snacks, and art and school supplies to keep them engaged and creative over the summer break.

The SENSE Charter music teacher, Sara Whittle, was able to purchase six guitars and instruction books through this program. These were given to students who had shown true promise in her music class, but did not have a guitar at home. These students will also receive Zoom lessons with Mrs. Whittle throughout the summer to further develop their guitar skills and receive continued exposure to varying genres of music. Students who received the guitars were truly excited about having their own guitar to keep, as many have not had the opportunity to play a guitar since mid-March due to the COVID-19 shutdown of the schools.
