### Letter from the President

Neighborhood President's Priorities Series (Part 3): Attracting & Maintaining Socioeconomic Diversity

It's time to touch on the third topic of this five-part series, which aims to highlight the five main priorities for our residents, local businesses, and community partners during my time as the neighborhood association president of our Bates-Hendricks community! This particular topic goes hand-in-hand with the buzz word "gentrification", so it's fair to assume this priority may not have a quick or simple solution by those natural problem-solvers throughout the community. If you haven't guessed it yet, we're talking about "Attracting and Maintaining Socioeconomic Diversity" within our neighborhood.

Socioeconomic diversity is commonly associated with two more fundamental, related issues that can hinder the effectiveness of such diversity: gentrification and

displacement. Gentrification deals more with a pattern of reinvestment and revitalization in a low-income neighborhood, whereas displacement is a pattern of change where current residents are involuntarily forced to move out because they can no longer afford to stay in the gentrified neighborhood. With that being said, it's also important to continue to experiment with new and different ways of connecting to neighbors who the neighborhood association may have had trouble engaging with in the past. I'm also proud that our neighborhood does include a small pocket of transit-oriented development around our Redline bus stop near Shelby and Pleasant Run, which will hopefully flourish into another diverse piece of our community. Here are some things you could do to help us attract and maintain this essential piece of neighbor diversity:

- Develop partnerships with other local nonprofits, community development organizations, and workforce development organizations to create a pipeline of initiatives and multi-stakeholder efforts.
- Regularly engage with the Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association's board and committees with ideas for improvement and/or opportunities for development.
- Volunteer on one (or several!) nonprofit, community development organizations to gain additional perspective on how our community can better address the needs of those residents who aren't being adequately addressed.
- Think proactively of what a new development or business could possibly do to positively and/or negatively impact the socioeconomically-diverse characteristic of the neighborhood. Sometimes not all things are as great as they seem after doing a tiny bit of research and independent thinking!





children and their families to play and learn for years to come.
