SENSE Kindergarteners Learn About Story Concepts

The Kindergarten students practiced these skills with stories written by author Mo Williams. These stories included the book "There's a Bird On Your Head!". In this story, the character Piggie helps his friend Gerald the Elephant get a bird's nest off of his head after the birds decided to build there. The students created nest hats made from cardboard bowls and small pieces of

brown paper. They also glued birds inside of the bowls and then wore them as hats!


