#### **Egg-speriment! Diversity and the Scientific Process**

In wrapping up our Black History Month Unit experience we wanted to create a fun and memorable way of exploring diversity and likeness on a new level. As grown-ups, we know that overall humans are the same on the inside. We may vary slightly but generally; our insides look the same so treating people differently based on the outside seems silly. As children, they process this, but they often may not be able to articulate it.

In our science "egg-speriment" the goal was to provide the kids with the words to explain why being a good and kind human to everyone is important. We started by observing 4 eggs. Two were brown and two white, however all four were different. Not all people appear the same on the outside, neither do eggs. The kids wrote down their observations based on one brown egg and one white egg. We discussed the observations. We discussed predictions about what we thought we would see on the inside of each egg. Then we broke open each egg, one at a time.

We observed that our predictions were, overall, correct and we saw the yellow yoke and the surrounding mucus membrane. In each there were




slight differences but they each had the same general makeup. Finally, we related this to us as humans. We discussed how some of us have more fatty tissues or "spots" on the inside, but we all had, with small exceptions, the same working parts. We discussed how if humans have the same parts, do we need to treat people differently or unkindly? The consensus was, no, we can treat people as we want to be treated and celebrate our differences. Two of our favorite quotes from this activity are, "Differences make us beautiful." and "We're just like eggs! Same on the inside and, some of us are spotted on the outside!" We loved doing this egg-speriment with our children! We think it achieved the goal of a fun and memorable way of exploring diversity and likeness!
