## **Bates-Hendricks Elects New President & Board Members**

At the April 4 annual meeting, the Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association General Membership voted to add three new Board Directors to fill vacant positions. Please welcome Catherine Bowie, Gina Christofaro, and Erin Chatten Nunley!

Meanwhile, James Bulow, Brandon Mott, Rob Uppencamp, and Nick Zimmerman were re-elected as Board Directors. Cody Long was the only Board Director not currently up for election and continues into the second year of his two-year term.

Matt Nunley stepped down as President after serving for two years of the three-year term. James Bulow volunteered himself for President and the Board of Directors and General Membership confirmed him. The Board Directors will fill the remaining vacant Officer positions (Vice President, Treasurer, & Secretary) from amongst the Board members per the Bates-Hendricks Neighborhood Association bylaws.

#### SENSE Expands Its Technology Program into the Third Dimension

SENSE Charter School is expanding its technology program in the direction of 3D printing and modeling. 3D printing, or additive manufacturing, is the construction of a threedimensional object from a computer-aided design (CAD) model or a digital 3D model. As part of the middle school technology elective, students will be designing their own 3D models and printing them out. Using the free, online rendering software Tinkercad, students will be able to build anything in their imagination. Then, students transfer those files into a program that creates instructions for 3D printers to print the models the students have designed. So far, SENSE has printed out dragons, Kirbys, Pokémon, and many, many sharks, which is the school's mascot.

"3D printers can be fun for kids. You can create little things and print it. It's like making your own toy" says Nehemiah Blanford, team captain of the elementary team. "I'm going to make a shark. I love sharks."



Earlier this year, the SENSE Robotics Teams took first place in both the middle school and elementary categories of Nextech's CS For Good competition, a state-wide computer science fair, in which students develop computer science solutions to community and societal problems. Both individual students and SENSE Charter School were awarded cash prizes for winning, which were used to purchase two Ender 3 V2 3D printers, and loads of filaments, or the "ink" used in 3D printers.
