ProPEL Indy Studying the Future of Our Interstates

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) has initiated ProPEL Indy, a two-year planning study with a unique opportunity for residents, neighborhoods, businesses, and commuters to envision the future of I-65 and I-70 in the heart of the



city. The study is seeking bold concepts and ideas that will modernize the interstates and improve the region's overall mobility, equity, economic opportunity, and quality of life.

ProPEL Indy's goal is to identify transportation needs and community goals along I-65 and I-70 inside I-465. ProPEL Indy will set the long-term vision for investment in our interstates and the future of Indianapolis, balancing bold ideas with sound engineering and responsible financial management.


