Letter from the President

Neighbors, sometimes you need help resolving an issue with another neighbor. Hopefully you've been able to talk to your neighbor. Sometimes that's possible, sometimes it's not. And sometimes talking things through does not provide an amicable solution. When it's not possible reach a solution, and you need some help, here are a few resources that may provide the intervention you need:

First, if you need help with a loose or aggressive animal, report it to the Mayor's Action Center aka RequestIndy (https://www.indy.gov/activity/request-indy). The same site is also available as an app called RequestIndy that works the same way. Or, if there's a crater of a pothole that needs to be filled, your trash wasn't picked up, there's an unresolved zoning violation, and many other issues, RequestIndy can help with that too. The site will provide a reference number for your report BHNA President, James Bulow so that you can track it.

Second, if you cannot resolve a difference with a neighbor and need someone to help settle your dispute, you could contact the Indy Center for Conflict Resolution to see if they can help mediate a resolution between you and the other neighbor. (https://www.indypsf.org/iccr). This group has come to our neighborhood before to let us know about the peacemaking work that they do.

And third, if there is an issue that isn't an emergency (e.g. someone in a short term rental decides that the whole block should hear the party all night long), but you need IMPD's help, you call IMPD's non-emergency line (317-327-3811). Please call 911 for emergencies, but for other interventions, the number above will get you in contact with IMPD.

Indy DPW Announces 2024 Leaf Collection Season

The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (Indy DPW) announced this year's leaf collection will run from Tuesday, November 12 to Tuesday, December 3 in Bates-Hendricks. Residents can leave up to 40 bags of leaves for pickup per week on their regularly scheduled collection day during the four-week collection period at no additional cost. During the week of Thanksgiving, leaf collection will be operating on a slide schedule.



Indy DPW collects thousands of tons of leaves each year from Marion County residents. Leaf collection dates coincide with the time of year when the most leaves are determined to fall from trees.

Here are a few guidelines to follow during leaf collection season:

- Place leaves in plastic bags. Paper bags can deteriorate and break apart in inclement weather.
- Keep bags at least three feet away from your trash cart for easy pickup.
- Leaf bags should be outside by 7:00am on your normal trash day.

As in years past, the collected leaves will be taken to the South Side Landfill. The South Side Landfill will not offer composting this year. Residents can also bring their leaves to Greencycle. GreenCycle administers a \$20 fee to drop off leaves, and they will be composted; however, GreenCycle does not accept plastic bags. Mowing the leaves in your lawn is a great resource for mulch.

While raking leaves, Indy DPW asks that residents clear leaves from storm drain inlets to prevent drainage and flooding problems. Residents should not rake leaves into the streets; this will cause issues with Indy DPW Operations street sweepers. Residents should also remember that burning leaves is illegal in Marion County as it releases harmful particles into the air.

Outside of the four-week leaf collection season, residents can place bags of leaves inside their trash cart or take them to the Citizens' Transfer Station on Saturdays. If crews miss a route for leaf collection service, residents should follow the same procedure as a missed trash pickup by opening a service request via RequestIndy or by calling the Mayor's Action Center at 317-327-4622.
